

With respect to the above mentioned subject, letters has been received from CCA offices requesting DOT (Hq) to issue necessary guideline for taking action at CCA level against M/s BSNL for non-payment of LF and SUC from 3rd Quarter of FY 2018-19. In this regards, it is to intimate that with respect to the M/S BSNL cabinet has approved the revival of BSNL and merger of BBNL with BSNL on 27.07.2022 as per DoT HQ OM. No. 20-28/2022-PR dated 02.08.2022, wherein at Para 2.2 it is mention that *"Settlement of AGR dues of BSNL (₹-33,407 Cr as on 31.03.2022) through equity conversion including GST of ₹ 5,344 Cr. The Government will provide budgetary support to BSNL. AGR dues to BSNL would also be settle on the same principle for 5 years from 1st Apr. 2022 onwards...."*

2. In view of the above, I am directed to convey that BSNL payments for their LF and SUC dues up to the FY 2026-27 will be settle as per cabinet decision i.e. through Equity conversion. Thus, CCAs are requested to timely finalize the BSNL DVR (on SARAS), for on time assessment of BSNL at DoT(Hq).

Subject: SOP regarding realizing government dues and handling Corporate Insolvency Resolution Process (CIRP) cases-reg.

It has been observed that there is an inordinate delay in filing claims by certain wings/field offices of DoT leading to these claims not being admitted and extinguished once the resolution plan is passed. To avoid such scenarios in future an SOP is formulated to ensure timebound filing of claims and follow up necessary actions as per the rules/regulations of Insolvency Bankruptcy Code (IBC) 2016.

Standard Operation Procedure (SOP) for Insolvency cases

1. For Licensees whose assessment is done centrally

Step 1: Intimation about CIRP initiation

- LFP wing will monitor all Licensees and will disseminate information about insolvency to the office of CGCA, DG(T) and other wings of DoT. Office of CGCA and DG(T) will communicate with Pr. CCAs/CCAs and LSAs respectively.
- LFP wing will obtain Company Specific Subscription on IBBI website via Corporate Identification Number (**CIN**) of the Company to get regular updates about initiation of insolvency and its status thereafter.

Step 2: Consolidation of Dues and filing of Claims to Insolvency Resolution Professional (IRP)

- Office of CGCA and DG(T) will consolidate dues along with proof of claims pertaining to CCAs, and LSAs respectively and file them in the required format to the Insolvency Resolution Professional (**IRP**)/Official Liquidator (**OL**) within the required time frame without fail. Each office which raises the demand against the licensee is responsible for defending the same before IRP/OL or

any judicial forum as the case may be. A final copy of the filed dues must be shared with LFP wing.

- All other wings of DoT, whoever raises any demand, will consolidate dues along with proof of claims for defending the same and submit to LFP wing in a time bound manner for onwards filing to IRP. No request for onward submission of the claims will be accepted after the cutoff date is passed.

Step 3: Representing DoT in NCLT/NCLAT/Supreme Court

- LFP will be nodal wing to correspond with the Resolution Professional (RP) after filing of dues regarding finalization of the Resolution Plan and defending the interest of the Department before the committee of creditor (COC), Stakeholder Consultation Committee and NCLT, NCLAT and Supreme Court as the case may be.
- While defending the case, LFP wing may assign some responsibilities to any wing/field unit of the Department as the need arises.

In case the Resolution Plan fails:

In the above scenario, the concerned company goes for liquidation and the whole process of submitting claims starts afresh. Dues along with interest may be recalculated upto the Liquidation Commencement Date as mentioned in the Public Announcement.

- If such a case arises, Step 2 and Step 3 will again be repeated in the same manner as defined above.

2. For Licensees whose assessment is done at PrCCA/CCA level

Step 1: Intimation about CIRP initiation

- Office of Pr. CCAs/CCAs will be responsible for monitoring such licensees and disseminate information about insolvency to the office of CGCA, LFP, DG(T) and DS wing who may further disseminate the information to relevant stakeholders.
- PrCCA/CCA will obtain Company Specific Subscription on IBBI website via Corporate Identification Number (CIN) of the

Company to get regular updates about initiation of insolvency and its status thereafter.

Step 2: Consolidation of Dues and filing of Claims to Insolvency Resolution Professional (IRP)

- Concerned Pr. CCA/CCA will take necessary actions with respect to the consolidation of dues and filing of claims.
- Other wing/office will provide consolidated dues, if there are any, to the office of concerned Pr. CCA/CCA before the cutoff dates.
- Each office which raises any type of demand against the licensee must be ready to defend the same before IRP/OL/any judicial forum as the case may be
- No request for onward submission of claims from any wing/field office will be entertained after the cutoff date is passed.

Step 3: Representing DoT in NCLT/NCLAT/Supreme Court

- Concerned Pr. CCA/CCA will represent the Department in Committee of Creditors and NCLT and take all necessary steps for defending the interest of the Department. The concerned Pr CCA/CCA office should keep informed CGCA and LFP wing about all proceedings.
- LFP wing will handle the case in NCLAT and Supreme Court if the need arises.

In case the Resolution Plan fails:

In the above scenario, the concerned company goes for liquidation and the whole process of submitting claims is once again started. Dues along with interest may be recalculated up to the Liquidation Commencement Date as mentioned in the Public Announcement.

- If such a case arises, Step 2 and Step 3 will again be repeated in the same manner as defined above.

3. For Licensees issued by WPC

WPC wing will monitor all the operators/companies whom they issue license or allocate administrative spectrum. Individual licensing group in WPC wing who raises the demand will be responsible for filing and defending the claims before IRP/OL/any judicial forum and share a copy of final dues submitted to IRP/OL with LFP wing. And follow the case in NCLT, NCLAT or Supreme Court whenever required.

In case the Resolution Plan gets rejected:

In the above scenario, the concerned company goes for liquidation and the whole process of submitting claims is once again started. Dues along with interest may be recalculated upto the Liquidation Commencement Date as mentioned in the Public Announcement.

- If such a case arises, the above given process will again be repeated in the same manner as defined above.

4. It is to be noted that during the period of Corporate Insolvency Resolution Process, the concerned office may raise a demand against the licensee against the current dues arising out of use or continuation of the license during the moratorium period.
5. It is also to be stated that all wings of DoT/Field offices who are responsible for raising demands against a licensee, are solely responsible for realization of the same. The responsibility does not end with submission of claims. Each concerned office must be vigilant of CIRP proceedings until the logical resolution of their claims.
6. In case of licenses whose assessment is done by PrCCA/CCAs or WPC, a quarterly report should be submitted to LFP wing regarding the insolvency/liquidation status of all their licensees/operators and the steps taken therein for realization of their claims.
7. Licensing Wings of DoT will provide a certified list of all the companies with the type of license and the CIN of the Company to LFP wing within two weeks of this SOP coming into force.
8. All Legal cases other than the insolvency process will be dealt by those offices who are currently responsible for the same.
9. National Institute of Communication Finance (NICF) shall organize a periodic training program related to process of filing claims and other issues related to Insolvency and Bankruptcy Code, 2016 at regular interval.

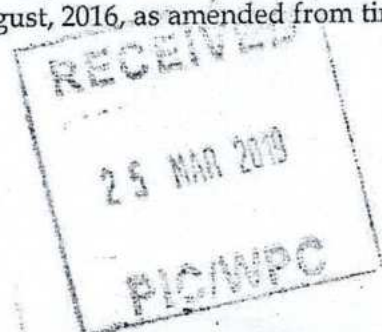

This is with reference to the review meeting of O/o CGCA by Member(F).

DDG (WPF) had presented a PPT (copy enclosed) with the agenda items as given below:

- i. TSP wise Outstanding SUC dues (non included in Hon'ble SC AGR judgment) as on 31.03.2023. Figures highlighted in red for M/s. BAL, VIL and RJIL are the net outstanding SUC dues which are reported by respective Assessing Authorities as recoverable from the operators vide report submitted by O/O CGCA vide email dt.04.10.2023.
 - ii. CCA wise Outstanding SUC dues as on 31.03.2023 with number of representations pending along with their aging schedule.
 - iii. CCA wise revision status of assessment of BAL and VIL in light of surrender of their MWA/MWB spectrum
 - iv. Pending CAG para replies for report 11 and 35 of 2017 from some CCA offices.
2. In this regard, Member (F) has directed following action to be initiated:
- a. With respect to the outstanding dues, there will be revision of SUC dues for M/s.VIL on grounds of revision of AGR, surrender of MWA/MWB spectrum and liberalization of spectrum in certain circles for the years not included in Hon/ble SC AGR judgement. On this issue, a letter vide No.1020/02/2023-WR, dated 10.10.2023 was sent to O/o CGCA. In addition, dues of M/s. BAL also needs to be revised on grounds of surrender of MWA/MWB spectrum and revised AGRs, if any.
 - b. In addition, dues for other operators may also be thoroughly reviewed in accordance with the guidelines/orders issued by WPF Wing from time to time so that the recoverable portion of SUC dues as on 31.03.2023 is calculated correctly. While reviewing these dues, it may be ensured that latest AGRs as finalized by LFA wing are only taken into consideration. Year wise list of finalized AGRs for BAL, BHL, VIL & RJIL is attached herewith for ready reference. It may further be ensured that SUC assessments is done only for the years not included in Hon'ble SC AGR judgement. The due date for completing this exercise is 10.11.2023. Outstanding SUC dues with interest updated upto 31.03.2023 as

detailed in Lr. No.1020/02/2023-WR, dated 04.08.2023 may be resubmitted in Annexure-I & II by 10.11.2023.

- c. Following the review of the Outstanding SUC dues for the TSP, action is to be initiated by assessing authorities for recovery of the recoverable portion (i.e. the part which is not under litigation/representation/ appeals and also not covered under moratorium) of the Outstanding SUC dues within 1 month. A compliance report may be furnished by 30.11.2023.
- d. CAG reports will be settled once full compliance of the paras as detailed in PPT attached is furnished by the CCA offices by revising their SUC demands. A report for full compliance may be furnished by 15.11.2023 positively.
- e. In addition, the representations with respect to SUC need to be monitored by O/o CGCA regularly for their timely settlement and accordingly revision of the dues.

Sir,

As per the decision of the Union Cabinet vide its meetings held on 23-10-2019, 27-07-2022 and 07-06-2023, the frequency spots are being assigned to you along with the effective date of assignment and date of expiry as per details mentioned in Annexure -I. Technical parameters are attached at Annexure-II. The spectrum assignments detailed in Annexure-I and Annexure-II are being done post confirmation of necessary payments by WPF Wing vide their letter dated 25-10-2023 in connection with the Demand issued by them vide letters dated 18-07-2023 and 10-10-2023.

2. The frequency assignment, contained in Annexure-I, is subject to the following:
- i. There shall be no change in the frequency assignment or any technical parameters associated therewith, as detailed in Annexure-I, without the prior written approval of Wireless Planning and Coordination (WPC) Wing, Department of Telecommunications, Ministry of Communications.
 - ii. The Government reserves the right to change the frequency spots and technical parameters at any point of time over the duration of its validity period of 20 years, whenever it is required for harmonizing bands and promoting spectrum efficiency.

Vmth

- iii. The individual carriers can be combined, provided they are not administratively assigned, to make use of new technology requiring larger bandwidth. Technology other than GSM/CDMA/WCDMA/LTE/IMT-2020 (5G technology), employed in each band in each LSA, shall be intimated to WPC Wing, wherein prior approval is required.
- iv. The Base Stations along the borders are to be registered with ITU, through WPC Wing, in order to effect co-ordination in the case of cross-border interference.
- v. The Base Stations near international border shall be so located and operated that the radio signals emanating therefrom, fade out at the international border to an extent to become unusable at the international border, but this condition may be relaxed with the agreement of the administration concerned.
- vi. The new Base Stations or changes to the existing Base Stations to employ the frequencies assigned herein shall not cause harmful interference to a station operating in accordance with the technical parameters authorised by WPC Wing.
- vii. Limits/levels on EMF exposure by Base Stations should be restricted to the limits as prescribed by the Department of Telecommunications from time to time.
- viii. An officer authorised by WPC Wing may inspect the wireless stations to verify that the said stations operate as per technical parameters assigned.
- ix. The SACFA clearance for all the Base Stations shall be obtained from WPC Wing as per the extant procedure.
- x. The wireless equipment to be employed shall be imported, if required, as per the extant procedure.
- xi. The frequency assignment shall be revoked or temporarily suspended, as the case may be, for violation of unauthorised use of frequencies and technical parameters associated therewith, breach of the conditions stipulated in the service license (UL) or non-payment of fees/charges associated with the spectrum.
- xii. The continuation of frequency assignment is subject to fulfilment of all payment terms, adherence to conditions stipulated in the relevant service licenses (UL) and the relevant provisions of the applicable Notice Inviting Applications (NIA-2022).
- xiii. For spectrum in 700 MHz band and 2100 MHz band, which is being assigned with prospective effect, the SUC rate of 0% shall be applicable in the weighted average SUC rate calculation. Further, for spectrum in 900 MHz band and 1800 MHz band, (which is being regularized now) from 29-02-2020 to 31-08-2021 and in 3 LSAs in 1800 MHz band from 29-02-2020 to 30-06-2024) an SUC rate of 3% shall be applicable till 20-06-2022 and 0% from 21-06-2022 to 30-06-2024.

(Note : On 21-06-2022, SUC order incorporating 0% SUC rate is issued & in similar manner, with the approval of competent authority, SUC rates are made applicable earlier also for 900 MHz band which was allocated with retrospective effect.)

xiv. The above terms and conditions are without prejudice to any other action that may be taken by the Government.

3. The terms and conditions governing frequency spots assigned earlier, if any, would be as per the respective frequency assignment letters. Changeover of frequency spots, if any, shall be done at the earliest not later than 2 weeks' time from the date of issue of this letter.







**MINUTES OF THE REVIEW MEETING ON RECOVERY OF OUTSTANDING
SUC DUES HELD ON 09.01.2024**

A review meeting was conducted on outstanding SUC dues through VC in Committee Room, 2nd floor on 09.01.2024 under the chairmanship of Member (F).

2. The meeting was attended by the officers mentioned in Annexure-1.
3. The agenda of the meeting is given hereunder:
 - a. Review of status of outstanding SUC dues
 - b. Action taken by Assessing Authorities for realization of the dues which are recoverable
4. In opening remarks, Member(F) expressed his serious concern over non finalization of the outstanding SUC dues and realization of recoverable dues by the Assessing Authorities. Member (F) emphasized that the recovery of outstanding SUC dues is of utmost importance and the task mandated to the Assessing Authorities is to assess, raise demand notes and realise revenue on annual basis. Thus, Member (F) directed all the Assessing Authorities to ascertain the outstanding SUC dues correctly, segregate sub-judice amount and take all the necessary measures to recover balance dues as per license agreement.
5. DDG (WPF) illustrated possible issues which have been disputed by licensees either in court of law or otherwise. Same are mentioned hereunder:
 - i. Sub-judice cases
 - Additional SUC charges in cases of sharing of spectrum (TP-01/2023)
 - Charging of Floor SUC amount (TP-09/2017)
 - SUC rate for 3G (2100 MHz) spectrum acquired in 2010 Auction in cases of expiry of licenses (TP-28/2016)
 - MWA/MWB rates (2002 or 2006/2008 rates) (CA-8232/2019)
 - ii. Other issues
 - Item at Sl. No.8 of Revenue Stt: Revenue from Sale and Lease of Bandwidth
 - Apportionment of IUC charges (Revenue & Deductions) between Wireline & Wireless Revenue
 - Zero BWA revenue but miscellaneous incomes reported
 - Negative AGR in some quarters taken as ZERO AGR
 - SUC rate in cases of merger of TSPs
 - Pending Appeals
6. The above issues are detailed in Annexure-2 for taking necessary action in such cases/issues.
7. Subsequently, the data sheets containing CCA-wise/TSP wise/Year-wise SUC outstanding dues of M/s. BAL & M/s. RJIO were presented by DDG (WPF). DDG (WPF) stated that the data related to outstanding SUC dues presented is based on the information submitted by Assessing Authorities which in turn compiled and forwarded by O/o CGCA. The

SUC outstanding dues are categorized as "Demand", "Sub-judice amount" & "Balance (recoverable amount)".

8. Member (F) sought reasons for pendency in recoverable outstanding SUC dues from all the Assessing Authorities and noted that certain CCAs had huge pendency of recoverable outstanding SUC dues such as Karnataka, Jharkhand, Gujarat, Maharashtra, etc.. Some CCAs viz Kolkata, Jammu & Kashmir, Madhya Pradesh, Assam, HP etc. have made commendable performance on this count. Member (F) re-iterated need for expeditious segregation of outstanding SUC dues which is free from any litigation in any court of law and its realisation in time bound manner in accordance with provisions in Licence Agreement.

9. CCA-wise pendency regarding no. of appeals by licensee along with amount under appeal was also discussed. Member (F) emphasized need for co-ordination between Assessing Authorities and Appellate Authorities. All CCAs were directed by Member (F) to take necessary action for disposal of the appeals on a priority basis. Member(F) reiterated that prescribed timelines in this regard should be adhered to.

10. Member (F), in order to have proper monitoring of SUC dues realization work and for reducing the pendency of recoverable outstanding SUC dues, directed following:

- i. CGCA should include review of outstanding dues in Zonal level meeting and action taken report should be sent to DOT HQ
- ii. At Zonal level, Pr. CCAs to conduct meetings with the CCAs under their jurisdiction to sensitize them on the early recovery of recoverable dues.

11. Member (F) also felt the need for active co-ordination of Assessing Authorities with TSPs/Licensees and suggested holding informal/formal meetings with concerned licensee for realization of the outstanding SUC dues and to initiate suitable action in accordance with UL/UASL agreement for recovery of dues except:

- a. Dues covered in AGR judgment of Hon'ble SC
- b. Sub judice dues (i.e. pending court cases/CIRP) to avoid contempt of court in any case.
- c. Dues covered under 2nd moratorium offered by DoT and accepted by Licensee

12. In end, DDG (WPF) summarized following actions points:

- Adjustment of central credits adjustment of M/s. VIL dues as per the guidelines issued vide Lr.No. AS-13/5/2019-Office of DIR(AS-V)-Part(1), 02.01.2024 and endorsed by O/O CGCA vide email dated 04.01.2024.
- Reversal of payment/credits by M/s. RJIL for years not included in Hon'ble SC AGR Judgement, if any, as per the guidelines issued vide Lr. No:1034/05/2023-WR, dated 04.01.2024 and endorsed by O/O CGCA vide email dated 05.01.2024.
- Surplus adjustment (only in case of surplus amounts as per assessment order) as per extant guidelines.
- Disposal of appeals as per prescribed time frame through a speaking order
- Realisation of recoverable amounts (which are not sub-judice)
- Completion of SUC Assessment for 2022-23 by 31/01/2024

13. DDG(WPF) further intimated all Assessing Authorities that spectrum holding of all the licensees has been updated in SARAS and requested all to check & certify it by 31/01/2024. In event of any discrepancy, it may be brought to the notice of Director(WR) at virender.vats@gov.in and singh.tanvika@gov.in.

14. The meeting ended with a vote of thanks to all the participants.

Issues related to SUC Assessment

Court Cases:

1. Additional SUC charges in cases of Sharing:

The matter is sub judice under TP-01/2023, filed by M/s. Reliance Jio. The matter of contention is applying additional SUC rate of 0.5% in cases of spectrum sharing on band in which sharing is taking place or on overall weighted average.

TDSAT vide order dated 09.01.2023 has stayed the operation of order dated 11.10.2022 (i.e. order issued for charging additional SUC rate of 0.5% on overall weighted average in cases of sharing).

2. Charging of Floor SUC amount:

The matter is sub judice under TP-09/2017 filed by M/s BAL. The matter of contention is applying floor amount of SUC in accordance with SUC charging order dated 12.08.2016.

TDSAT vide Order dated 27.12.2021 in TP-9 of 2017 has quashed the "Clause (iii) of the SUC Order 12.08.2016 (referred in Para-3 in order No.L-14010/01/2021-NTG, dated 21.06.2022) regarding floor amount of SUC"

Presently, the TDSAT order has been challenged by DOT in Hon'ble Supreme Court.

3. SUC rate for 3G (2100 MHz) spectrum acquired in 2010 Auction in cases of expiry of licenses:

The matter is sub judice under TP-28/2016, filed by COAI, Bharti Airtel and Vodafone Idea Ltd. The matter of contention is charging SUC rate @ 3% or 5% for 3G (2100 MHz) spectrum acquired in 2010 auction in cases where the administrative spectrum has expired.

As per the SUC order dated 12.08.2016, the SUC rate will be 5% in r/o the Licensees whose license has expired.

The interim order dated 30.05.2016 issued by TDSAT is made applicable to Kolkata & Himachal Pradesh Circles and all the other circles are applying 5% of SUC rate for 3G (2100 MHz) spectrum in cases whose license has expired (i.e. where the administrative spectrum has expired). However no coercive action is to be taken.

4. MWA/MWB rates in cases of pending for reassignment:

The matter is sub judice under CA No.8232/2019 filed by M/s VIL. The matter of contention is charging 2002 rates or 2006 rates on MW carriers pending for re-assignment.

Hon'ble TDSAT in its order dated 13 Mar, 2019 allowed DOT to charge as per 2006/2008 order from prospective date. DOT appealed against this order in Hon'ble Supreme Court vide C.A No.8232/2019 which in its order dated 08.11.2019 stayed the operation of TDSAT order dated 13.03.2019 in TP No.38 of 2017.

MWA/MWB links were re-assigned to M/s BAL on its migration from UASL to UL with Access Service Authorisation in respective LSAs subject to outcome of this case.

However, SUC is payable as per 2006 order w.e.f. date of its Access Service Authorisation under UL.

Other Issues

1. Considering the revenue related to Leased line as Wireless Revenue:

The matter of contention is related to levy of SUC on "Revenue from Sale and Lease of Bandwidth".

As per the existing guidelines the "Revenue from Sale and Lease of Bandwidth", to be reported at Sl. No.8 in statement of revenue, is treated as miscellaneous revenue and is being apportioned between wireline & wireless revenue. Position of DOT is very clear on this issue.

2. Apportionment of IUC charges (Revenue & Deductions) between Wireline & Wireless Revenue:

Presently, revenue & deductions of IUC are being apportioned based on Wireline & Wireless revenue as per the existing guidelines.

TSPs are representing for considering the actual revenue & deductions of IUC submitted in the Annexure along with the "Statement of Revenue" instead of apportioning.

Position of DOT is very clear on the subject. Revenue Statement, which forms integral part of License Agreement, does not provide reporting of revenue & deductions of IUC separately for Wireline & Wireless. Hence, present procedure of apportioning it between wireline & wireless is correct.

3. Zero BWA revenue but miscellaneous incomes reported.

Assessing Authorities are applying SUC rate on total AGR (including Misc Income) whereas licensor is contending that there should not be any SUC as revenue from BWA spectrum is Zero.

SUC is charged on Applicable AGR which is inclusive of miscellaneous revenue. Hence, assessment has been done correctly.

4. Negative AGR in some quarters taken as ZERO AGR instead of cumulating on Annual basis.

This issue has been clarified vide DOT order No:1-22/2016-LFP-I/Part, dated 15.11.2023. Assessing Authorities may assess accordingly.

5. SUC rate in cases of merger of TSPs:

The relevant para of Merger guidelines issued vide Lr. No.20-281/2010-AS-I (Volume-VII), 20.02.2014 is reproduced hereunder:

"J) The Spectrum Usage Charge (SUC) as prescribed by the Government from time to time, on the total spectrum holding of the resultant entity shall also be payable"

Based of the above guidelines, various scenarios were clarified vide Lr. No.1000/10/2022-WR, dated 19.12.2022. Assessments may be done accordingly.



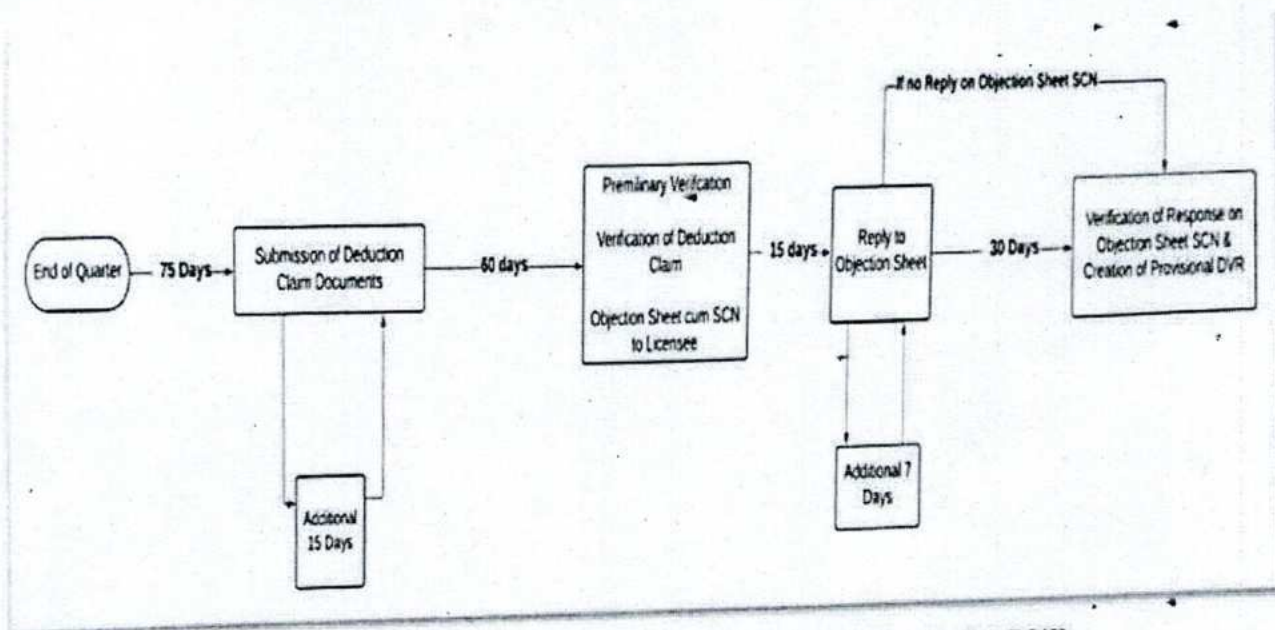


Fig (above): Timeline for preparation of Provisional (Quarterly) DVR

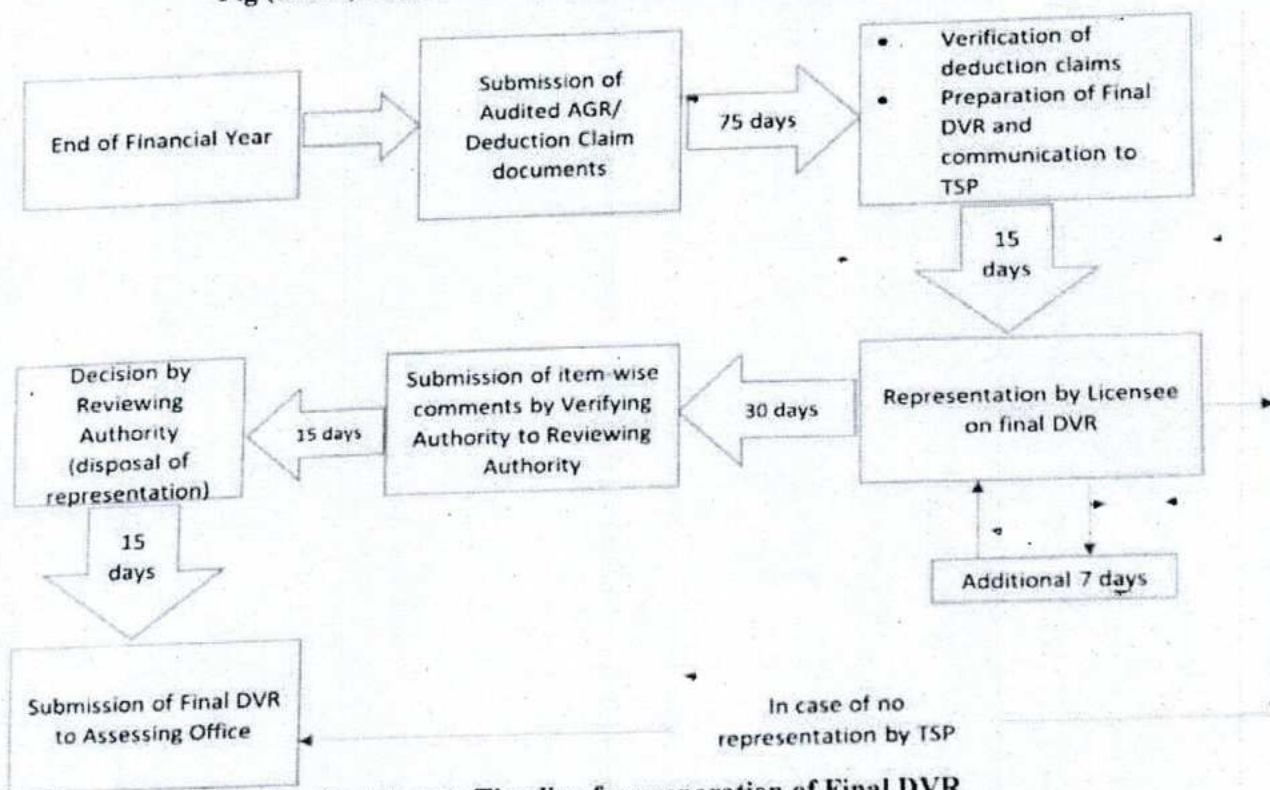


Fig (above): Timeline for preparation of Final DVR

2. The payment terms are governed by Clause 20.4 of Unified License Agreement and equivalent clauses of other license agreements. Vide Clause 20.4 of UL agreement, it is stated that –

*"License Fee shall be payable in four quarterly installments during each financial year (FY). Quarterly installment of license fee for the first three quarters of a financial year shall be paid **within 15 days of the completion of the relevant quarter**. The AGR based license Fee shall be paid by the Licensee on the basis of revenue on accrual basis for the quarter, duly certified with an affidavit by a representative of the Licensee who is authorized by the Board*

Resolution coupled with General Power of Attorney. However, for the last quarter of the financial year, the Licensee shall pay the License Fee by 25th March on the basis of expected revenue for the quarter, subject to a minimum payment equal to the revenue share paid for the previous quarter."

3. M/s VIL has made short payment of the quarterly License Fee (LF) dues (on self-assessment basis) for Q2 of FY 2023-24 and has thus breached the provisions of the License Agreement. The details of AGR, LF paid and LF due of M/s VIL for Q2 of FY 2023-24 on self-assessment basis (as per SARAS) is as follows:

2. 

2. The payment terms are governed by Clause 20.4 of Unified License Agreement and equivalent clauses of other license agreements. Vide Clause 20.4 of UL agreement, it is stated that –

*"License Fee shall be payable in four quarterly installments during each financial year (FY). Quarterly installment of license fee for the first three quarters of a financial year shall be paid **within 15 days of the completion of the relevant quarter**. The AGR based license Fee shall be paid by the Licensee on the basis of revenue on accrual basis for the quarter, duly certified with an affidavit by a representative of the Licensee who is authorized by the Board*

Resolution coupled with General Power of Attorney. However, for the last quarter of the financial year, the Licensee shall pay the License Fee by 25th March on the basis of expected revenue for the quarter, subject to a minimum payment equal to the revenue share paid for the previous quarter."

3. M/s VIL has made short payment of the quarterly License Fee (LF) dues (on self-assessment basis) for Q2 of FY 2023-24 and has thus breached the provisions of the License Agreement. Sir,

As per the decision of the Union Cabinet in the meeting held on 27.07.2022, the frequency spots assigned to you, consequent to harmonization exercise carried out in certain LSAs, along with the Effective date of assignment and Date of expiry are as per details mentioned in Annexure-I. Technical parameters are attached at Annexure-II. The provisions w.r.t charging SUC is placed at Annexure - III.

2. The frequency assignment, contained in Annexure-I, is subject to the following:
- (i). There shall be no change in the frequency assignment or any technical parameters associated therewith, as detailed in Annexure-I, without the prior written approval of Wireless Planning and Coordination (WPC) Wing, Department of Telecommunications, Ministry of Communications.
 - (ii). The Government reserves the right to change the frequency spots and technical parameters at any point of time over the duration of its validity period of 20 years, whenever it is required for harmonizing bands and promoting spectrum efficiency.
 - (iii). The individual carriers can be combined, provided they are not administratively assigned, to make use of new technology requiring larger bandwidth. Technology other than GSM/CDMA/WCDMA/LTE/IMT-2020 (5G technology), employed in each band in each LSA, shall be intimated to WPC Wing, wherein prior approval is required.
 - (iv). The Base Stations along the borders are to be registered with ITU, through WPC Wing, in order to effect co-ordination in the case of cross-border interference.
 - (v). The Base Stations near international border shall be so located and operated that the radio signals emanating therefrom, fade out at the international border to an extent to become unusable at the international border, but this condition may be relaxed with the agreement of the administration concerned.

- (vi). The new Base Stations or changes to the existing Base Stations to employ the frequencies assigned herein shall not cause harmful interference to a station operating in accordance with the technical parameters authorised by WPC Wing.
- (vii). Limits/levels on EMF exposure by Base Stations should be restricted to the limits as prescribed by the Department of Telecommunications from time to time.
- (viii). An officer authorised by WPC Wing may inspect the wireless stations to verify that the said stations operate as per technical parameters assigned.
- (ix). The SACFA clearance for all the Base Stations shall be obtained from WPC Wing as per the extant procedure.
- (x). The wireless equipment to be employed shall be imported, if required, as per the extant procedure.
- (xi). The frequency assignment shall be revoked or temporarily suspended, as the case may be, for violation of unauthorised use of frequencies and technical parameters associated therewith, breach of the conditions stipulated in the service license (UASL/ UL) or non-payment of fees/charges associated with the spectrum.
- (xii). The continuation of frequency assignment is subject to fulfilment of all payment terms and adherence to conditions stipulated in the relevant service licenses (UASL/UL).
- (xiii). The above terms and conditions are without prejudice to any other action that may be taken by the Government.
3. The terms and conditions governing frequency spots assigned earlier, if any, would be as per the respective frequency assignment letters. Changeover of frequency spots, if any, shall be done at the earliest not later than 2 weeks' time from the date of issue of this letter.

OFFICE MEMORANDUM

Subject: Provisional assignment/extension of the spectrum rights which is expiring in the year 2024, before the conclusion of next spectrum auction (Auction 23-24) to avoid disruption of public services.

The competent authority has decided that operating TSPs (excluding those in Corporate Insolvency Resolution Process) whose spectrum is going to expire in the year 2024, before the conclusion of next spectrum auction (Auction 23-24), shall be permitted to retain such spectrum on prior written request for interim period i.e. for the period from the date of expiry till the completion of Auction 23-24 process, which would include time for assignment and time for migration required when such spectrum is assigned to non-incumbent bidder. The terms and conditions for this extension shall be as follows:

- i. TSPs requesting DoT for retaining such spectrum (Annexure – I) for the interim period shall pay spectrum charges for this period that will be equal to the pro-rated amount based on the Auction Determined Price of Auction 23-24. Till the Auction Price is determined in the Auction 23-24, the provisional price as per Annexure -I, shall be used.
- ii. TSPs opting for spectrum continuation, shall pay in advance, as per the above provisional price, for a 3 - months period.
- iii. If Auction 23-24 does not conclude within this initial 3 - months period, subsequent extensions for every 3 months shall be allowed, each requiring advance payment as envisaged in (ii) above.
- iv. After the conclusion of the Auction 23-24, any excess in spectrum charges paid by TSPs for the duration of extension, will be adjusted in the first instalment/upfront payment, without interest. In case of shortfall, additional demand shall be payable. In event of failure to pay such demand, such amount shall be recovered from any bank guarantee available with DoT.
- v. For this interim period, all Terms and Conditions of Auction 22-23, as per NIA 2022 dated 15-06-2022, shall be applicable on the TSP.
- vi. In event of incumbent TSP not winning such spectrum in Auction 23-24, a maximum transition period up to two months shall be allowed to the incumbent TSP from date of declaration of the provisional result of Auction 23-24.

- vii. Further, for the spectrum which is expiring in the year 2024 and whose assignment is extended through this interim arrangement, Effective Date for such spectrum, when acquired by the same licensee who is holding the spectrum, in Auction 23-24, will be the day following the expiry date of the earlier assignment (i.e. day following the expiry date mentioned in Annexure-I).
2. The application for extension of expiry by a TSP shall include the details such as the LSA, band, quantum of spectrum required (limited to the existing administrative holding that is expiring in 2024), along with other technical parameters.
3. On acceptance of the above terms and conditions, the same shall become part of the existing license agreement.

Please refer to the OM No.1000/01/2020-WR, dated 11.10.2022 wherein the Methodology for arriving at SUC rate in cases of Spectrum Sharing was circulated.

2. Pursuant to TDSAT order dated 09.01.2023 in TP No.01/2023, the OM dated 11.10.2022 on the subject was kept under abeyance till further orders, vide letter dated 27.01.2023. Presently, the case is still pending in Hon'ble TDSAT.

3. Hence, Assessing Authorities may do SUC assessment of M/s.RJIL, for the years not included in AGR judgement by Hon'ble SC, as follows:

- i. The SUC assessment may be done by both ways i.e. by applying additional sharing rate of 0.5% on band in which sharing is taking place and by applying additional sharing rate of 0.5% on overall SUC weighted Average Rate (WAR).
- ii. The SUC assessment done by applying additional sharing rate of 0.5% on band in which sharing is taking place, shall be issued to the licensee.
- iii. The difference between assessed amount post application of additional SUC @ 0.5% on overall WAR and the SUC @0.5% on specific band shall be categorized as amount under litigation.
- iv. Disclaimer is to be inserted in the Demand Note that "***The additional SUC rate of 0.5% applied on band is subject to outcome of the case in Hon'ble TDSAT in TP-01/2023. Department reserves the right to revise the demand notes as per the Hon'ble TDSAT order or any other instructions from DoT Hq***"
- v. Surplus SUC amount paid by the TSP beyond the assessed amount as detailed in (ii) above (i.e. after applying additional sharing rate of 0.5% on band which is being shared) shall be adjusted as per extant guidelines.

Sub: Final Minutes of the Eastern Zone Conference on SUC held on 1st & 2nd March, 2024 at Bihar Circle, Patna-reg.

The Eastern Zone Review Meeting on Revenue and Spectrum related matters was held on 01.03.2024 & 02.03.2024 at Patna, Bihar, under the chairmanship of Respected Member (F) & DCC, Sh. Manish Sinha, with Pr. CCA, Kolkata, Dr. Shikha Mathur Kumar and all the Circle Heads of Eastern Zone along with their team members in attendance. The following officers and officials were present in the meeting:

and officers/officials from all the circles of the Eastern Zone.

The meeting started with the welcome note by Sh. Alok Kumar Pandey, Jt. CCA (Bihar). Further, Sh. Rajeev Kumar, CCA (Bihar) formally welcomed all the respected participants of Eastern Zone Review Conference and invited Pr.CCA, Dr. Shikha Mathur Kumar to felicitate Respected Member (F) & DCC.

Pr. CCA, Kolkata, Dr. Shikha Mathur Kumar in her inaugural address mentioned that the main agenda of the meeting is to have a clear picture of undisputed outstanding SUC dues and formulate a strategy to clear these dues on priority. She mentioned that healthy discussions on SARAS, Calculation of SUC, Spectrum

Holdings and Spectrum Auctions in the review meet will be very fruitful and will provide a better clarity to all the participants. She hoped that this Conference would be a great opportunity for all the officers/officials present, as this would result in sharing of knowledge and best practices among all circles. She also mentioned that the discussion would be fruitful if we achieve the target of recovery before the end of this financial year. Pr. CCA then requested Respected Member (F) & DCC to address the gathering.

Respected Member (F), DCC during his keynote address mentioned that the CCAs are responsible for realizing outstanding SUC dues and they should be focused on all outstanding SUC dues other than the disputed amount. Further, Member (F) asked to differentiate between the disputed and undisputed amount of outstanding SUC dues clearly. Member (F) motivated and directed all the officers/officials at every level to put their best efforts for the SUC assessment to avoid frequent updation of the outstanding dues which need to be finalized in totality.

He suggested proper documentation and urged not to hesitate to give time to the stakeholders for settlement of undisputed outstanding SUC dues. He also advised to approve the AGR excluding Wireline, Spectrum Holdings and Weighted Average Rate firstly from all levels. After that, the calculation of SUC should be put up for approval to avoid any error while calculating SUC outstanding dues. Further, he mentioned that before issuing demands to the TSPs, a formal meeting should be conducted to minimize the discrepancies and realize the SUC dues.

Post the keynote address by Respected Member (F), a handbook named "AANKLAN", on the best practices adopted by O/o Pr.CCA, Kolkata in the assessment of decentralized licensees was released by Member (F), DCC along with other senior dignitaries.

The first session was taken up by Sh. Shivendu Gupta, DDG (WPF Wing), DoT HQ. He discussed all the aspects of SUC calculation, Spectrum Holdings, SARAS related issues, circulars and guidelines issued by DoT HQ time to time. He mentioned that no clarification of SUC related issue is pending as on date at the end of DoT HQ and SARAS is now compatible to do SUC assessment properly. The following points have been discussed by DDG (WPF):

1. WR section has issued clarifications on applying SUC in cases of spectrum sharing vide their letter No. 1034/05/2023-WR dated 26.02.2024 and 1012/01/2023-SF (P1-II) dated 28.02.2024.
2. OM No. P-14010/05/2016 dated 12.08.2016 may be followed for calculation of floor amount.

3. Illustrations regarding SUC rate calculation has been circulated vide OM No. 1000/10/2022-WR dated 19.12.2022 and corrigendum dated 13.01.2023.
4. The payment of the SUC dues pertaining to FYs included in the Hon'ble Supreme Court Judgment is being monitored centrally. Efforts are to be taken to realize and recover the SUC dues which are not included in the Hon'ble Supreme Court and Moratorium.
5. Surplus adjustment will be done in respect of LF and SUC as per OM No 1-9/2019-LFP-I dated 09.10.2019 and 18.10.2022.
6. The calculation of interest in respect of 2nd Moratorium is detailed in OM No 19-2/2022/LFA/Outstanding dues dated 03.11.2022.
7. DDG (WPF) also emphasized that Assessing Authority should conduct meetings with TSPs to minimize the discrepancy and realize the outstanding dues before issuing Demand Notices and the minutes should be issued thereof so that the undisputed outstanding SUC dues may be recovered.

This was followed by a healthy Q&A session with all circles getting various clarifications and valuable guidance from DDG, WPF.

Further, Sh. Abhay Kumar Singh, DDG (NICF) addressed the gathering and mentioned that NICF is a good platform to discuss various issues of LF, SUC and Spectrum related matters. He assured that a workshop will be conducted for all the officers and officials of Department of Telecom entrusted with the work of LF and SUC assessment. He described the aspects and importance of iGOT Mission Karmayogi and encouraged all participants to utilize the opportunity fruitfully. He also mentioned that World Telecom Standardization Assembly-2024 is going to be held at Pragati Maidan, New Delhi from 14th to 24th Oct, 2024 and encouraged healthy participation.

Sh. DalzakamValte, CCA West Bengal and Kolkata then discussed the issues and outstanding dues related to SUC for Pr.CCA, Kolkata and CCA, West Bengal Circle and how efforts are being made to realize the same at the earliest. It was also highlighted by the officer that during the approval of SUC Assessment through SARAS, no e-sign is required but it is applicable for LF Assessment of ISPs. Therefore, CCA West Bengal and Kolkata has requested to DoT (HQ) to take up the matter with SARAS helpdesk.

Sh. Alok Kumar Pandey, Jt.CCA, Bihar presented the current position and issues w.r.t. the Bihar Circle. Respected Member (F), DCC asked to submit the undisputed SUC dues in r/o M/s VIL to WPF section DoT HQ, New Delhi post the recent revision for adjustment of the same. In connection with BSNL SUC outstanding dues, Respected Member (F) instructed to settle the SUC outstanding dues as these dues had already been settled through equity conversion as per Cabinet decision and DoT HQ OM No 20-28/2022-PR dated 02.08.2022.

Sh. Dipankar Mahto, CCA Jharkhand discussed the issues and recoverable outstanding dues of Jharkhand Circle. He pointed out that Para (iii) and illustrations given in Annexure II of WPC wing, DoT HQ OM No. P-14010/05/2016 dated 12.08.2016 are mutually contradictory.

For arriving at Floor SUC rate, Para (iii) mentioned that spectrum in 2300 MHz/2500 MHz/band acquired/allocated prior to 2015-16 is to be excluded, whereas in the illustration given in Annexure-II, spectrum held in 2300 MHz/2500MHz band acquired/allocated prior to 2016 Auction needs to be excluded. Hence, this issue may be clarified from DoT HQ. DDG (WPF) replied that O/o CCA, Jharkhand may take up this matter to DoT HQ to issue clarification on it.

Sh. Heikrunjam Prasanject, ACCA, O/o CCA, Assam presented a PPT in connection with issues and aspects of Spectrum Usage Charge and Outstanding Dues that pertains to his circle. Further, Sh. Aditya Das, AO represented NE-I Circle and discussed the issues relating to realization of undisputed outstanding SUC dues.

After that, Sh. Sajal K, Jt CCA, NE-II Circle presented a PPT in connection with realization of undisputed outstanding SUC dues.


Further, Sh Shivendu Gupta, DDG (WPF) discussed about the features of spectrum auction in general and the tentative forthcoming Auctions of spectrum in the near future. He described the process of auction in detail. The process of Auction has been defined as SMRA (Sequential Multiple Round Ascending Auction) where the operators can bid simultaneously in particular Bands/LSAs as per their requirements. He also talked about EMD and the role of eligible points in the auction process. Further the session concluded with a healthy Q&A session with the participants.

Later, Sh. Vivek Drolia, Jt.CCA (O/o Pr. CCA Kolkata), addressed the gathering to share bits about the handbook "AANKLAN". He discussed various best practices adopted by O/o Pr.CCA Kolkata in the assessment of decentralized licensees along with successful case studies.

At last Respected Member (F) & DCC addressed and thanked the gathering for such stimulating discussions in the sessions. He was pleased to be a part of such informative and interactive session that all the doubts and confusions and the resolutions regarding SUC assessment have been discussed in a wholesome manner. He also emphasized to explore the wide aspect of spectrum to play an important role in Indian economy.

It is also pertinent to mention that Respected Member (F), along with other dignitaries visited the CCA office before the beginning of the session of the 2nd day and Member (F) inaugurated the newly renovated Sanchar recreation club in the office premises and dedicated it to all the officers/officials of CCA, Bihar.

At the end of the two day review meet, Sh. Alok Kumar Pandey, Jt.CCA, Bihar delivered the Vote of Thanks to all the venerable participants of this conference and appraise them for their valuable and informative guidance in connection with realization of undisputed outstanding SUC dues and also thanked the chair for entrusting Bihar circle with the responsibility of hosting the Eastern Zone Review Meet.

Subject: Assignment of frequencies to BSNL in the 700 MHz and 2100 MHz band - reg.

Reference: (i) BSNL CO-RGLN/28/1/2020-REGLN/E-1834 dated 07-02-2024.

Sir,

As per the decision of the Union Cabinet vide its meetings held on 23-10-2019, and 07-06-2023, the frequency spots are being assigned to you along with the effective date of assignment and the date of expiry as per details mentioned in Annexure -I. Technical parameters are attached at Annexure-II. These spectrum assignments are being done post confirmation of necessary payments by WPF Wing vide their letter dated 10-04-2024 in connection with the demand issued by them vide letter dated 18-03-2024.

2. The frequency assignment, contained in Annexure-I, is subject to the following:
- i. There shall be no change in the frequency assignment or any technical parameters associated therewith, as detailed in Annexure-I, without the prior written approval of Wireless Planning and Coordination (WPC) Wing, Department of Telecommunications, Ministry of Communications.
 - ii. The Government reserves the right to change the frequency spots and technical parameters at any point of time over the duration of its validity period of 20 years, whenever it is required for harmonizing bands and promoting spectrum efficiency.
 - iii. The individual carriers can be combined, provided market determined price was paid for the spectrum, to make use of new technology requiring larger bandwidth. Technology other than GSM/CDMA/WCDMA/LTE/IMT-2020 (5G technology), employed in each band in each LSA, shall be intimated to WPC Wing, wherein prior approval is required.
 - iv. The Base Stations along the borders are to be registered with ITU, through WPC Wing, in order to effect co-ordination in the case of cross-border interference.




- v. The Base Stations near international border shall be so located and operated that the radio signals emanating therefrom, fade out at the international border to an extent to become unusable at the international border, but this condition may be relaxed with the agreement of the administration concerned.
- vi. The new Base Stations or changes to the existing Base Stations to employ the frequencies assigned herein shall not cause harmful interference to a station operating in accordance with the technical parameters authorised by WPC Wing.
- vii. Limits/levels on EMF exposure by Base Stations should be restricted to the limits as prescribed by the Department of Telecommunications from time to time.
- viii. An officer authorised by WPC Wing may inspect the wireless stations to verify that the said stations operate as per technical parameters assigned.
- ix. The SACFA clearance for all the Base Stations shall be obtained from WPC Wing as per the extant procedure.
- x. The wireless equipment to be employed shall be imported, if required, as per the extant procedure.
- xi. The frequency assignment shall be revoked or temporarily suspended, as the case may be, for violation of unauthorised use of frequencies and technical parameters associated therewith, breach of the conditions stipulated in the service license (UL) or non-payment of fees/charges associated with the spectrum.
- xii. The continuation of frequency assignment is subject to fulfilment of all payment terms , adherence to conditions stipulated in the relevant service licenses (UL) and the relevant provisions of the applicable Notice Inviting Applications (NIA-2022).
- xiii. For spectrum in 700 MHz band and 2100 MHz band, which is being assigned with prospective effect, the SUC rate of 0% shall be applicable in the weighted average SUC rate calculation.
- xiv. The above terms and conditions are without prejudice to any other action that may be taken by the Government.

3. The terms and conditions governing frequency spots assigned earlier, if any, would be as per the respective frequency assignment letters. Changeover of frequency spots, if any, shall be done at the earliest not later than 2 weeks' time from the date of issue of this letter.

Subject: Monitoring of Telecom licensees proceeding under liquidation/CIRP proceedings.

When pursuing realization of outstanding dues of License Fees and Spectrum related dues (SUC, Auction related dues, One Time Spectrum Charges etc.) from licensees, it is important to ensure that the dues are duly filed with the Resolution Professional/ Official Liquidator etc. in case of insolvency/ liquidation or related relevant processes. The following guidelines in addition to earlier instructions regarding pursuit of outstanding dues may be followed by all concerned offices for pursuit of outstanding dues in such cases:

- (i) All assessing authorities in DoT HQ /Field offices who are responsible for raising demands of License Fees and Spectrum related dues (SUC, Auction related dues, One Time Spectrum Charges etc.) against a licensee are required to raise all demands in a time bound manner. Regular follow up after issue of demand notices must be done by the assessing authorities who are also required to ensure timely filing of dues as per public announcements under Insolvency and Bankruptcy Code 2016 or other relevant laws/ rules.
- (ii) In case of non-payment of dues, penal action must be taken as per license agreement including but not limited to encashment of BGs, issuing show cause notice etc. without delay.
- (iii) All public announcements of commencement of Corporate insolvency resolution /liquidation process may be checked regularly in the offices concerned with resolution/liquidation. One example where such checks can be made is IBBI website (<https://ibbi.gov.in/en/public-announcement>). Registration for regular intimation may also be available and may be made use of. Regular monitoring by all Pr.CCA/CCA offices is to be done for all licensees coming under their jurisdiction.
- (iv) In case a licensee with outstanding dues is found to be in insolvency/ liquidation or related relevant process, the assessing authority may immediately file the dues with the concerned Resolution Professional/ Official Liquidator etc. within the prescribed timeline. This issues with approval of Competent Authority.

Subject: SOP regarding realizing government dues and handling Corporate Insolvency Resolution Process (CIRP) cases-reg.

It has been observed that there is an inordinate delay in filing claims by certain wings/field offices of DoT leading to these claims not being admitted and extinguished once the resolution plan is passed. To avoid such scenarios in future an SOP is formulated to ensure timebound filing of claims and follow up necessary actions as per the rules/regulations of Insolvency Bankruptcy Code (IBC) 2016.

Standard Operation Procedure (SOP) for Insolvency cases

1. For Licensees whose assessment is done centrally

Step 1: Intimation about CIRP initiation

- LFP wing will monitor all Licensees and will disseminate information about insolvency to the office of CGCA, DG(T) and other wings of DoT. Office of CGCA and DG(T) will communicate with Pr. CCAs/CCAs and LSAs respectively.
- LFP wing will obtain Company Specific Subscription on IBBI website via Corporate Identification Number (CIN) of the Company to get regular updates about initiation of insolvency and its status thereafter.

Step 2: Consolidation of Dues and filing of Claims to Insolvency Resolution Professional (IRP)

- Office of CGCA and DG(T) will consolidate dues along with proof of claims pertaining to CCAs, and LSAs respectively and file them in the required format to the Insolvency Resolution Professional (IRP)/Official Liquidator (OL) within the required time frame without fail. Each office which raises the demand against the licensee is responsible for defending the same before IRP/OL or

any judicial forum as the case may be. A final copy of the filed dues must be shared with LFP wing.

- All other wings of DoT, whoever raises any demand, will consolidate dues along with proof of claims for defending the same and submit to LFP wing in a time bound manner for onwards filing to IRP. No request for onward submission of the claims will be accepted after the cutoff date is passed.

Step 3: Representing DoT in NCLT/NCLAT/Supreme Court

- LFP will be nodal wing to correspond with the Resolution Professional (RP) after filing of dues regarding finalization of the Resolution Plan and defending the interest of the Department before the committee of creditor (COC), Stakeholder Consultation Committee and NCLT, NCLAT and Supreme Court as the case may be.
- While defending the case, LFP wing may assign some responsibilities to any wing/field unit of the Department as the need arises.

In case the Resolution Plan fails:

In the above scenario, the concerned company goes for liquidation and the whole process of submitting claims starts afresh. Dues along with interest may be recalculated upto the Liquidation Commencement Date as mentioned in the Public Announcement.

- If such a case arises, Step 2 and Step 3 will again be repeated in the same manner as defined above.

2. For Licensees whose assessment is done at PrCCA/CCA level

Step 1: Intimation about CIRP initiation

- Office of Pr. CCAs/CCAs will be responsible for monitoring such licensees and disseminate information about insolvency to the office of CGCA, LFP, DG(T) and DS wing who may further disseminate the information to relevant stakeholders.
- PrCCA/CCA will obtain Company Specific Subscription on IBBI website via Corporate Identification Number (CIN) of the

Company to get regular updates about initiation of insolvency and its status thereafter.

Step 2: Consolidation of Dues and filing of Claims to Insolvency Resolution Professional (IRP)

- Concerned Pr. CCA/CCA will take necessary actions with respect to the consolidation of dues and filing of claims.
- Other wing/office will provide consolidated dues, if there are any, to the office of concerned Pr. CCA/CCA before the cutoff dates.
- Each office which raises any type of demand against the licensee must be ready to defend the same before IRP/OL/any judicial forum as the case may be
- No request for onward submission of claims from any wing/field office will be entertained after the cutoff date is passed.

Step 3: Representing DoT in NCLT/NCLAT/Supreme Court

- Concerned Pr. CCA/CCA will represent the Department in Committee of Creditors and NCLT and take all necessary steps for defending the interest of the Department. The concerned Pr CCA/CCA office should keep informed CGCA and LFP wing about all proceedings.
- LFP wing will handle the case in NCLAT and Supreme Court if the need arises.

In case the Resolution Plan fails:

In the above scenario, the concerned company goes for liquidation and the whole process of submitting claims is once again started. Dues along with interest may be recalculated up to the Liquidation Commencement Date as mentioned in the Public Announcement.

- If such a case arises, Step 2 and Step 3 will again be repeated in the same manner as defined above.

3. For Licensees issued by WPC

WPC wing will monitor all the operators/companies whom they issue license or allocate administrative spectrum. Individual licensing group in WPC wing who raises the demand will be responsible for filing and defending the claims before IRP/OL/any judicial forum and share a copy of final dues submitted to IRP/OL with LFP wing. And follow the case in NCLT, NCLAT or Supreme Court whenever required.

In case the Resolution Plan gets rejected:

In the above scenario, the concerned company goes for liquidation and the whole process of submitting claims is once again started. Dues along with interest may be recalculated upto the Liquidation Commencement Date as mentioned in the Public Announcement.

- If such a case arises, the above given process will again be repeated in the same manner as defined above.

4. It is to be noted that during the period of Corporate Insolvency Resolution Process, the concerned office may raise a demand against the licensee against the current dues arising out of use or continuation of the license during the moratorium period.

5. It is also to be stated that all wings of DoT/Field offices who are responsible for raising demands against a licensee, are solely responsible for realization of the same. The responsibility does not end with submission of claims. Each concerned office must be vigilant of CIRP proceedings until the logical resolution of their claims.

6. In case of licenses whose assessment is done by PrCCA/CCAs or WPC, a quarterly report should be submitted to LFP wing regarding the insolvency/liquidation status of all their licensees/operators and the steps taken therein for realization of their claims.

7. Licensing Wings of DoT will provide a certified list of all the companies with the type of license and the CIN of the Company to LFP wing within two weeks of this SOP coming into force.

8. All Legal cases other than the insolvency process will be dealt by those offices who are currently responsible for the same.

9. National Institute of Communication Finance (NICF) shall organize a periodic training program related to process of filing claims and other issues related to Insolvency and Bankruptcy Code, 2016 at regular interval.

This is with reference to the Lr. Ni.VIL/RCA/2024/May/0601-002, dated 06.05.2024.

2. It is requested to refer to the "Guidelines for allotment of residual spectrum in 1800 MHz band as a result of spectrum auction held in November-2012" issued vide DoT Lr. No.L-14010/01/2016-NTG, dated 30.09.2016 (copy enclosed) under which M/s Vodafone had applied for allotment of residual spectrum. The relevant para of the guidelines are given hereunder:

"Para-(i) The residual spectrum will be governed by conditions laid down in the Notice Inviting Application dated 28.09.2012 issued for the auction of spectrum held in November, 2012. The residual spectrum shall be treated akin to spectrum acquired through the spectrum auction held in November, 2012."

3. Further, DoT had allotted the residual spectrum in 1800 MHz to M/s.Vodafone vide Lr. No.L-14004/02/2016-NTG, dated 05.12.2016. The relevant para reiterating the conditions are detailed hereunder:

"Para-2: The use of residual spectrum will be governed by all the relevant conditions laid down in the Notice Inviting Application dated 28.09.2012 and the relevant service license i.e. CMTS/UAS/UL and their amendments"

4. In view of the above, it is evident that the residual spectrum allotted to M/s.Vodafone in 1800 Mhz, shall be governed by the conditions laid down in the NIA-2012 and SUC rate shall be levied as per NIA-2012. Further, SUC weighted average rate will be calculated in accordance with the SUC order dated 12.08.2016.

5. Accordingly, the SUC rate applied by the Assessing Authorities for residual spectrum is in line with the DoT guidelines.



Guidelines for allotment of residual spectrum in 1800 MHz band as a result of spectrum auction held in November 2012

The Competent Authority, hereby, lays down the following terms and condition for allotment of residual spectrum in 1800 MHz band against the spectrum won in the auction held in November 2012, in which block size was 1.25 MHz.


- (a) This guidelines will be applicable for TSPs, who won spectrum in the spectrum auction held in November 2012 in the block size of 1.25 MHz/ 2.50 MHz/3.75 MHz.
- (b) The residual spectrum ranging from 0.05 MHz to 0.15 MHz will be assigned prorated for balance validity period of November 2012 allocation at the latest auction determined price. At present market price shall be the price to be discovered in the spectrum auction commencing from October 01, 2016.
- (c) The quantum of residual spectrum to be allotted is as under:

Quantum of spectrum won in 1800 MHz band in November 2012 Auction	Quantum of residual spectrum to be allotted
1.25 MHz	0.15 MHz
2.50 MHz	0.10 MHz
3.75 MHz	0.05 MHz

- (d) In case more than one set of auction determined prices are available, the latest auction determined prices available at the time when the TSP wants to acquire residual spectrum, would be applied.
- (e) If the auction determined price is more than one year old then the prevailing market rates would be determined by indexing the last auction price at the rate of SBI PLR.
- (f) The date of calculation of the total amount due for residual spectrum will be the fifteenth (15) days from the date of issue of Demand note and the same will be taken as the Effective Date of assignment of residual spectrum.
- (g) Payment will be required to be made within fifteen days from the date of issue of Demand Note, failing which the Demand note will be deemed to have expired and the TSP will have to make a fresh request for assignment of residual spectrum.

- (h) The residual spectrum can be combined with the spectrum chunk acquired by the TSPs in the spectrum auction held in November 2012.
- (i) The residual spectrum will be governed by conditions laid down in the Notice Inviting Application dated 28.09.2012 issued for the auction of spectrum held in November 2012. The residual spectrum shall be treated akin to spectrum acquired through the spectrum auction held in November 2012.
